Exhibitors will follow rules as listed under the Agricultural and Home Economics Exhibits.

1. Grain should be bright, clean of chaff, weed seeds, broken kernels and straw.
2. One gallon glass jars with lids or one-gallon plastic zip-lock bags are to be used to show grain in classes 14 through 22. If the fair management believes any of the exhibits were shown in previous years, those entries may be refused. **No items are going to be returned.**
3. Root balls should be enclosed in a plastic bag.
4. Exhibitors will be asked to identify the seed company and variety in the corn classes.
5. All exhibits are to have been harvested since Sept. 1, 2022.
