## DEPARTMENT 11, SECTION 13 - YOUTH VEGETABLES

1. In selecting vegetables for exhibition, choose specimens that would bring the highest market price. Do not select the largest, select medium-size specimens. If possible, do not mix varieties.
2. The following factors are generally used by an expert vegetable judge:
a. Trueness to variety type; all the specimens from only one variety.
b. Uniformity in shape, size and color.
c. Be sure to pick out a perfect specimen, then select the others as similar to it as possible. Never mix specimens of different maturity. The number of specimens needed for each class to be entered follows the class name.
d. Free from dirt, disease, infection, and mechanical damage. Select specimens that are perfect and show no blemishes of any kind.
e. Condition and maturity. Be sure exhibits are of high quality.
f. Potatoes should not be washed. Remove soil using a soft cloth or brush.
g. Tomatoes should have stems removed. Carrots, beets, etc. should have tops (leaves) removed from vegetables leaving about 2-inch stems.
3. Read premium material, carefully following all rules and regulations. If an entry calls for five specimens, be sure to exhibit that number. In any instance, exhibits will be disqualified if the correct number of specimens is not entered.
4. Small gummed labels or rubber stamps are timesaving in filling out entry tags.

## 2024 PA Preferred ${ }^{\text {® }}$ Junior Baking Contest Cookies, Brownies and Bars

 Made in PA. It makes a difference.The goal of the PA Preferred ${ }^{\oplus}$ Baking Contest is to encourage young people across the Commonwealth to participate in Pennsylvania's agricultural fairs by showcasing Pennsylvania grown and produced products in their contest entries.

RULES:

1. Open to any individual amateur baker (ages 8 through 18 at the time of the fair's contest) who is a Pennsylvania resident. One entry per person.
2. Entrants may NOT have won 1st place in this PA Preferred ${ }^{\ominus}$ Junior Baking contest at any other fair in 2024.
3. Entry must be six (6) individual sized portions of the baked entry item (cookies, brownies or bars).
4. The Cookies, Brownies or Bars, and any fillings and frostings, must be made from scratch with edible ingredients. No pre-packaged ingredients may be used (ex: no pre-made mixes, cookie dough, pie crust, frosting, etc.). Any decorations must just be edible.
5. At least two (2) PA Preferred ${ }^{\oplus}$ or locally produced ingredients must be used in the recipe. Some examples of qualifying ingredients include grains (such as oats or flour), butter, milk, eggs, fruits and/or vegetables.
6. A PA Preferred ${ }^{\ominus}$ logo is not required because not all PA Preferred ${ }^{\ominus}$ products carry the label. The name of the ingredient and the source is sufficient (see attached example). Contact RA-AGPAPreferred(opa.gov for any assistance with qualifying ingredients.
7. Entry must be submitted for judging on a food safe disposable setting. (All pans, plates and dishes are considered to be disposable and will not be returned.)
8. Recipe(s) must be submitted with the entry, printed on one side of $8-1 / 2^{\circ} \times 11^{\prime \prime}$ sheets of paper. Recipe must list all ingredients, quantities, and the preparation instructions. The name of each PA Preferred ${ }^{\ominus}$ ingredient or locally produced ingredient must be clearly listed along with the name of the source that made/grew the product (ex: PA Preferred Milk - Galliker's brand or Apples - Smith Farm Orchard). Entrant's name, age, address and phone number must be printed on the back side of all the pages. (All recipes and cookies-browries-bars will become the property of the Fair or PA Farm Show and will not be returned.)
9. Refrigeration is not available at the fair or PA Farm Show. Entries that require refrigeration after baking must indicate so in the recipe. Those entries will not be sold, auctioned or otherwise distributed for consumption after judging for food safety reasons.

## POSTER CONTEST

2024 Youth Poster Contest
The Pennsylvania Department of agriculture is conducting a statewide poster contest. Each fair in the State may submit a winning poster in each of the three age groups for the competition at the 2025 Farm Show in January.
Only one poster may be submitted per exhibitor per age group as follows: 8-11, 12-14, 15-18 as of June 1, 2024.

Poster size must be either $14 \times 22$ inches or $14.5 \times 22$ inches. Any other size will be disqualified.

This year's theme is "Connecting our communities". Contestants will be asked to submit artwork that showcases the pride and hard work of farmers from across the state, connecting people from all walks of life for a celebration of the importance of agriculture in our communities.
First place winning poster in each age group will be sent to Harrisburg for consideration for State awards of $\$ 100$, first: $\$ 75$, second, and $\$ 50$ third, regardless of age. All posters sent to Harrisburg will become property of the Pennsylvania Department of Agriculture for possible promotional use and may be returned by special request and arrangements for pick up.

1. Only one poster may be submitted per exhibitor, per age group. There will be three state competitions: ages 8-11, 12-14, and 15-18. Exhibitors must be in one of these age groups as of June 1 of the current fair season to qualify.
2. The poster size must be either $14 \times 22$ inches or $14 \frac{1}{2} \times 22$ inches. Other sizes will not be accepted for judging at the state level
