1. In selecting vegetables for exhibition, choose specimens that would bring the highest market price. Do not select the largest, select medium-size specimens. If possible, do not mix varieties.

2. The following factors are generally used by an expert vegetable judge.

- A. Trueness to variety type, all specimens from only one variety.
- B. Uniformity in shape, size, and color.
- C. Be sure to pick out a perfect specimen, then select others as much like it as possible. Never mix specimens of different maturity.
- D. Select specimens that are perfect, free from dirt, disease, infection, mechanical damage, or any blemishes.
- E. Be sure specimens are of high quality, condition, and maturity.
- F. Potatoes should not be washed, remove dirt with soft cloth or brush.
- G. Tomatoes should have the stems removed. Carrots, beets, etc. should have tops (leaves) removed leaving about 2- inch stems.
- 3. Read premium rules and regulations carefully, entries will be disqualified for incorrect number of specimens.
- 4. Small labels or rubber stamps are time saving in filling out entry tags.
