

## DEPARTMENT 17 FLORAL EXHIBITS

**ENTRY: Sun. Aug. 24, 2-5 & Mon. Aug. 25, 5-8**

**Pre-registration is encouraged to enhance the registration process.**

1. The use or display of artificial flowers is prohibited.
2. House plants will not be accepted for exhibition unless they have been growing in that container for at least two months.
3. All entries must have been grown by the exhibitor (except for minor fillings in the arrangement.)
4. Flowers and plants must be of more than ordinary standard and quality to be entitled for an award.
5. Small gummed name label or a rubber stamp are time saving in filling out entry tags.
6. All exhibits must be presented ready for display when arriving at the Fair. No work on premises permitted.

1. Arrangement of wildflowers, not over 20 inches high
2. "Pitcher Fun" arrangement in any type of pitcher
3. Bowl or vase of 5 different yellow flowers
4. Bowl or dish with one gladiolus and greens
5. Centerpiece using a candle.
6. Centerpiece using fresh garden flowers.
7. Arrangement using dried materials (No protected plants or noxious weeds)
