Exhibitors will follow rules as listed under the Agricultural and Home Economics Exhibits.

1. Grain should be bright, clean of chaff, weed seeds, broken kernels, and straw
2. One-gallon glass jars with lids or one-gallon plastic zip lock bags are to be used to show grain in classes 14-22
3. Root balls should be enclosed in a plastic bag
4. Exhibitors will be asked to identify the seed company and variety in the corn classes
5. All exhibits are to have been harvested since September 1, 2025.
