Entry Location: **Pavilion next to Grange Hall**

1. The use or display of artificial flowers is prohibited
2. House plants will not be accepted for exhibition unless they have been growing in that container for at least two months
3. All entries must have been grown by the exhibitor (except for minor fillings in the arrangements)
4. All cut flowers must be in suitable containers. NO paper or plastic cups will be accepted
5. Entries will be disqualified for the incorrect number of blooms, spikes, or stems required
6. Maximum care will be taken with containers, but the fair is not held responsible for damage or breakage
7. Arrangements should be in appropriate containers that compliment them
8. Judges are looking for plants and flowers that are above ordinary standards and quality to award ribbons
9. All exhibits must be presented ready to display when arriving at the Fair. No work on premises is permitted
10. Small labels or rubber stamps are time saving in filling out entry tags
